## **ABSTRACT**

Misinformation can be defined as false or inaccurate information created and spread with or without intention to cause harm. The impact and persistence of misinformation can be under-stood as a case of facts and evidence as counter-attitudinal information to those mis-informed. This presentation discusses the motivational biases and cognitive fallacies during message processing that explicates the impact and persistence of misinformation. Psychological Inoculation is introduced as a promising means to pre-bunk misinformation.

SHEN Lijiang (Ph.D., UW-Madison, 2005) is a professor at the Department of Communication Arts and Sciences, Pennsylvania State University. His primary research focuses on message processing and message effects in the context of health communication, and quantitative Methods.
